

Garden State rainbow Sports Golf League **Understanding Stableford Scoring**

Stableford scoring is a fun, points-based system that rewards good play and helps keep the game moving. Instead of counting every stroke, players earn points based on how well they score on each hole — so a bad hole doesn't ruin your whole round!

It's great for mixed-skill leagues like ours because it keeps things competitive and positive.





How It Works

At the end of each hole, you earn points based on how many strokes you took compared to par for that hole.

Score on the Hole	Stableford Points	Example
Double Bogey or Worse	0 points	2 strokes over par or more
Bogey	1 point	1 stroke over par
Par	2 points	You hit the expected number of strokes
Birdie	3 points	1 stroke under par
Eagle	4 points	2 strokes under par
Albatross (Double Eagle)	5+ points	3+ strokes under par (rare!)

© The Goal

Rack up the **most points** over 9 or 18 holes.

The better you play, the more points you earn. Missed a few shots? No stress — you move on to the next hole without it dragging down your whole round.

Why We Use Stableford

- Keeps the game friendly and upbeat
- Encourages risk-taking (go for that birdie!)
- Speeds up play no need to finish every hole if you're already over
- Levels the playing field for newer golfers

Pro Tip:

If you're not sure how to assign your points, don't worry — we've got a cheat sheet on hand during league play, or just ask a teammate. We're here to help!
